

Membership Privacy Statement

In Collaboration are committed to respecting and protecting the privacy of anyone using our site and the confidentiality of any information that you provide with us. The purpose of this statement is to set out how we use any personal information that we may obtain from you.

We are registered under the Data Protection Act 1998 and comply with the act in all our dealings with your personal data. We also comply with the GDPR (General Data Protection Regulations) in all our dealings with your personal data.

Use and collection of personal information

In general you can visit our website without telling us who you are and without revealing any information about yourself. However to become a member of the website you will be required to apply and will be asked to provide certain information such as your contact details. We will store this data securely and encrypted and hold it on computer or otherwise. For our membership website to function correctly and for you to use the website to it's full potential we are required to have certain details of your information public, such as your name, residing town and county. You can amend your public and private details and control which of your details are visible publicly through the profile settings option. Please note for the website to function some of your data must be made public within the closed membership area. If you do not consent to the data being made public within this area please do not use the membership service. By applying to and completing payment to become a member of In Collaboration you are accepting knowledge of our data use practice and agreeing to these terms.

We may use information that you provide:

- To register you with our website and to administer it.
- For assessment and analysis, e.g. marketing, customer and product analysis, to enable us to review, develop and improve our services.
- To allow you to be searched for and to search for other members near by
- To pass on to relevant third parties for your benefit. These may be additional services we think you may benefit from or that you are entitled to as part of your membership.

This website can only be used as a member when providing permission for some personal data to be shared with other members on the website. If you do not wish to agree to your personal data being used in this way please exit the application process now and refrain from using our website as a member.

If you do not wish to have your personal data passed on to third parties for added benefits and/or marketing purposes please tick the relevant box situated on the form on which we collect your data.

We may disclose your personal information to third parties:

- In the event we sell or buy any business or assets, in which case we might disclose your personal data to the prospective buyer or seller.
- If we are under a legal duty to disclose or share your personal data in order to comply with or meet any legal obligation.
- We may also disclose anonymous statistics about visitors to our website (both customers, members and sales) in order to describe our services to prospective partners (advertisers and sponsors) and other reputable third parties and for other lawful purposes. These statistics will be anonymous and contain no personally identifiable information and data.

Contract Execution

Your personal data will be used to provide the information, goods and services offered through our website to you, for billing and order fulfillment.

Email Newsletter

If you sign up to our newsletter we may use your email address to send you information about products or services. You may opt out of receiving mailing list emails from us at any point and you can ask for personal data to stop being recorded at any time. Please note that we do not recommend stopping email correspondence as a member due to the notifications, support emails and website updates we provide to all members via email that will affect all members. We are not responsible for any information not received by a member due to cancelling email correspondence, however it is your right to request the cancelation of email communications should you wish to make the request.

Cookies

We collect information directly from you in a number of ways; one way is through the use of 'cookies'. The majority of websites use cookies in order for them to work correctly or more efficiently, as well as to be able to provide information to the website owners. This will help us understand how our customers and potential customers use our website in order for us to be able to develop and improve the content, design, function and layout of the site. Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computers hard-drive by websites that you visit. They save and then retrieve pieces of information from your visit to that website. Information collected can be for example: how you entered the website, how you navigate around the website and which information was of interest to you. This allows the website to provide tailored options and information to your preferences when you return to the site, based on your last visit.

Some of our cookies are used simply for collecting information about how visitors are using our website. These types of cookies collect their information anonymously.

Where there is a login process relating to becoming a member, buying products or services through our website we also use cookies to store personal registration information so you do not have to provide this on subsequent visits.

When an application is made to become a member of In Collaboration and application is rejected, no information will be held after the decision has been made and implemented. All information and data will be forgotten. Details of registration will only be stored for those who are accepted so you do not have to provide your registration details on subsequent visits.

If you are uncomfortable with the use of cookies on this and other websites, you can disable cookies on your computer through changing the settings under the preferences or options menu in your browser. You can select for the browser to reject any cookies and to tell you when a website tries to place cookies on your computer, as well as having the option to delete all cookies that are already stored on the computer's hard drive. Please be aware that if you choose to block or delete all cookies, some elements of our website may not function correctly or to full efficiency due to some of the cookies we choose to use being essential for parts of this website to function.
